On December 11<sup>th</sup> the Inaugural LGPD Toy Drive took place with an extraordinary effort from Ofc. Taylor Falls. Her initiative and organization helped collect over 250 toys that were donated to the All Our Children Advocacy Center. The Director of AOCAC, Danielle Butts accepted the donations at the agency and expressed her gratitude for Ofc Falls and the Department's work. It was an outstanding community and LGPD team building activity. Ofc Falls was thankful for all the help and support from the Village, the Department, and all those who made donations.



Starting in early December the Police Department members began donating money to buy a La Grange youth a bicycle in order to replace the one he had that was destroyed in a crash at La Grange and Cossitt Ave in August 2016. Members of the Police and Fire Departments quickly rallied together and collected additional funds for other children in the Family. In total we were able to buy gifts for 5 kids ranging from ages of 3 months old to 14 years old. On December 23<sup>rd</sup> the Fire Department, Black Shift and Police Department Third Watch had the pleasure of presenting the gifts to the family, who were extremely grateful. All of the police and fire personnel involved should be commended for the generosity and kindness. Overall, another fine example of what sets the Village of La Grange apart.



On December 28<sup>th</sup> village and department members gathered at a farewell cake and coffee for retiring Chief of Police, Renee Strasser. The celebration included many accolades and gifts honoring her career and time with the La Grange Police Department. She devoted 27 years to the service of the La Grange Community and was well respected by all who knew her. The Organization wishes her the very best in all future endeavors and thanks her for her many years of dedicated service.

## MIDNIGHT SHIFT ACTIVITIES

### INVESTIGATIONS:

S/L Herrera, Ofc. Hon and Sgt. Ljubenko responded to and investigated a commercial burglary of a business located in the 100 block of North La Grange Rd. Officers responded to an activated alarm at the business and discovered the front glass entry door to be damaged/shattered. Offenders were not located on scene or in the surrounding area. Store management reported that nothing appeared to be taken/missing from the store. Offender(s) attempted to pry open a large metal cabinet/safe, but were unsuccessful. Investigators were called to the scene and the case turned over to the Investigation Division.

Ofc. Kang met with a complainant in the lobby of the P.D. who wished to make a delayed report of a battery which involved a co-worker and occurred at their work place in the 600 block of West Hillgrove Ave. Complainant advised that she and a female co-worker had engaged in a verbal argument. Their team leader sent both workers to see the supervisor. Complainant advised that while walking to the supervisor's office, the co-worker grabbed her neck and pushed her. Both subjects were sent home by the supervisor and the incident is under internal investigation by the company. Complainant did not wish to sign complainants or pursue criminal charges against the co-worker.

S/L Herrera, Ofc. Andries, Ofc. Hon and Sgt. Ljubenko responded to the 300 block of Blackstone Ave. for the reported suspicious activity/criminal trespass to property. Complainant advised that he observed, on his home security/surveillance system, a male subject and a second subject whose gender he could not determine, walking around his driveway, near his garage and vehicle which was parked in the driveway. He advised that the two subjects appeared to enter his unlocked vehicle and sit inside it for a short period of time. R/O's checked the complainant's vehicle, property and surrounding area for the subjects with negative results. R/O's viewed the surveillance tape with the complainant, but any video of the subjects being on his property or in/near his vehicle could not be located. Complainant confirmed that nothing was missing from his vehicle, it was undamaged and nothing in the interior appeared to be touched or disturbed.

Ofc. Hon, Ofc. Kang, Ofc. McDermott and Sgt. Rohlicek responded to the 100 block of Washington Ave. for a domestic disturbance incident between a mother and her adult son. The two subjects became involved in an argument which was verbal only in nature. Peace was restored, the son agreed to leave the residence and stay with friends for the day. Domestic violence information/forms were provided to subjects.

S/L Herrera, Ofc. McDermott, Sgt. Rohlicek and Sgt. Ljubenko responded to the 1000 block of South Catherine for a domestic disturbance/battery between husband and wife. The two subjects were involved in a verbal altercation which led to the wife blocking/preventing the husband from leaving, the two pushing/shoving each other, with both falling to the floor. Both subjects suffered minor injuries, both declined medical attention. Due to conflicting stories, mutual combatants, no arrest was made, no complaints signed. Subjects are attending counseling for their marital problems. Husband voluntarily left the residence to stay with nearby friends. Domestic violence information/forms were provided to both subjects.

Ofc. McDermott met with a complainant in the lobby of the P.D. regarding a forgery/identity theft incident involving his bank checking account. Complainant advised that he received information from his bank that a check from his account had been made out and cashed in the amount of \$1814.00 USC. Complainant advised he never wrote or made out any such check. The check was made out to a person he does not know and the signature on the check was not his, rather it had been forged by some unknown person. Complainant advised that approximately two years ago some items had been stolen out of his ex-wife's storage unit and that one of the check books from this account may have been taken at that time. Complainant's bank will open up a fraud investigation into the incident. Complainant provided with identity theft information. Case turned over to the Investigations Division.

S/L Herrera responded to the 0-100 block of South Ashland Ave. for the report of a suicidal subject. The male subject advised that he had recently been feeling depressed and was experiencing suicidal thoughts. LGFD Paramedics/Ambulance were called to scene, subject was voluntarily transported to Hines V.A. Medical Hospital for further evaluation and treatment.

S/L Herrera, Ofc McDermott and Sgt. Ljubenko responded to the area of La Grange/Ogden Ave. for the suspicious activity, possible criminal trespass to property incident at a construction site. R/O's met with complainants, who are private security officers, and discovered that the lock and chain on one of the perimeter fence gates along the west side of the site looked like it had been touched/manipulated. R/O and complainants made entry to and searched the interior of the building complex for any unwanted subjects with negative results. Complainants will advise the site manager to re-secure the perimeter security fencing.

S/L Herrera, Ofc. Kang and Sgt. Ljubenko responded to the 0-100 block of South Spring Ave. for the theft/criminal trespass to residence incident. Complainant advised he responded to a knock on his door and three female subjects, who he does not know, came into the apartment. One of the female subjects pulled down her top and exposed her breasts. The complainant told the subjects to leave his apartment, they replied, "Where was their money?" Complainant again ordered the subjects out and stated he was calling the police. The subjects grabbed his key ring and wallet off the kitchen table near where they were standing and left the apartment. The key ring had his apartment and car keys attached. The wallet contained I.D.s, credit cards and approximately \$40.00 USC. Complainant and his friend both denied knowing and/or inviting the subjects to the apartment. Complainant advised he would not be able to identify the subjects if seen again. Complainant was given identity theft information. Later that morning, complainant's wallet was found near Spring Ave./railroad tracks and turned into the P.D. The wallet contained all items except the USC. Wallet was turned over to the complainant.

Ofc. Kang, S/L Herrera, Ofc. Hon and Sgt. Rohlicek responded to the 300 block of East Plainfield Rd. for the domestic disturbance between a husband and wife. The two subjects had been involved in a verbal argument over various marital issues. The husband, who was highly intoxicated, then began throwing various items onto the floor in anger. The wife stated she would leave the residence for the evening to stay with relatives to deescalate the situation. The husband then began making statements about wanting to harm himself. LGFD Paramedics/Ambulance were called to

scene, the husband was transported to LaGrange Memorial Hospital for further evaluation and treatment. Domestic violence information/forms were provided to both subjects.

#### ARRESTS:

Ofc. McDermott made a warrant arrest on an 18 year old female subject from Hodgkins. Subject had two active warrants out of La Grange and Oak Lawn for Driving with No Valid Driver's License. Subject posted bond on both warrants and was given return court dates.

S/L Herrera and Ofc. Kang conducted a warrant arrest on a 26 year old male subject from Florida who had an active warrant out of Riverside for Aggravated Speeding. Subject posted bond and was given a return court date.

#### OTHER POLICE ACTIVITY:

The Midnight shift completed 100 traffic contacts which included 2 Misdemeanor Traffic Arrests for Driving While License Suspended/Revoked and investigated 1 hit and run property damage traffic accident. Shift Officers issued 148 parking citations for overnight parking and other violations. Shift Officers conducted 92 Building/Business Premise Checks and Foot Patrols. Shift Officers provided traffic control during the filming of a commercial for the Illinois Lottery. Ofc. Andries, Ofc. McDermott, TCO Montalvo, Sgt. Rohlicek and Sgt. Ljubenko participated and assisted in the Department's Community Christmas Party and Toy Drive to benefit the Children's Advocacy Center. Ofc. Andries completed teaching the fall semester D.A.R.E. course and conducted graduation ceremonies for the 5<sup>th</sup> grade classes at Seventh Avenue School.

#### TRAINING:

The shift successfully completed the December 2016 Police Law Institute online training along with the Lexipol Daily Training Bulletins. In addition, Ofc. Hon completed the SFST Refresher training course, Sgt. Ljubenko and D/C Peters attended the quarterly Terrorism Liaison Officer Committee (TLOC) meeting/training with the FBI.

## **AFTERNOON SHIFT ACTIVITIES**

### **INVESTIGATIONS:**

Investigative Case Reports taken this month included: Battery, Theft of Services, Telephone Harassment (4), Intoxicated Subject, Suicide (DOA), Warrant Service (2), Domestic Battery, Theft Under \$500, Residential Burglary, Missing Juvenile, Retail Theft, Fraud, Car Fire, Suspicious Activity, Child Neglect, Unlawful Visitation Interference, Attempt Deception, Damage to Village Property, Theft of Mislaid Property.

Ofc Burrell, along with several La Grange PD officers responded to the 5100 Block of South Willow Springs Road in reference to a Death Investigation. A 59-year old Countryside man was found deceased in his motor vehicle. The Cook County Medical Examiner's Office was immediately contacted and an agent of their department responded to the scene. The ME's office subsequently ruled the death a Suicide.

Ofc Nemecek and additional shift officers responded to the 100 Block of North Madison Avenue in reference to a Residential Burglary. Unknown offender(s) forced entry into the home through the back door, while the residents were away during the day. Residents of the home reported that items of jewelry and foreign currency valued at over \$31,000 were taken. A check of the immediate area and a canvass of the neighborhood yielded no suspects. The case was turned over to Investigations.

Ofc Irizarry responded to a restaurant in the 00 Block of South La Grange Road in reference to a Theft of Service. A 24-year old woman reportedly dined and had drinks at the restaurant prior to walking out without paying the bill. The woman was located by officers down the street from the restaurant in a parking lot. The woman was returned to the business and made full restitution of her bill. Irizarry issued the woman a No Trespass Order and she was sent on her way.

S/L Comstock and additional shift officers responded to the 100 Block of Washington in reference to a Domestic Battery complaint. Upon arrival, Comstock located a 15-year old male who advised he was battered and locked out of the house by his father. Officers provided care for the juvenile until a family member arrived to take custody of him. Illinois DCFS was also contacted. A check of the immediate area yielded negative results in locating the victim's father. The case is pending.

Ofc Cassiberry, along with FTO Irizarry and Ofc Rogers responded to a Man with a Gun complaint in the 100 Block of North La Grange Road. Officers initially arrived at the scene and spoke with several citizens who denied seeing anyone matching the description given by the

complainant over the 911-emergency line. The complainant, a 27-year old homeless male, was located a short distance away from the area of the call. After officers spoke with the male, it was determined that the original call was unfounded.

Ofc Niewold and additional officers responded to the 100 Block of Washington in reference to a Domestic Battery complaint. A woman reported that her ex-husband pushed her to the floor of their home during an argument. The woman reported no injury and did not wish to sign criminal complaints against the man. The man agreed to leave the residence for the night.

Officers Burrell and Irizarry responded to the 300 Block of Bluff Avenue in reference to a report of a car fire. Upon arrival, officers located a vehicle on the street with the engine engulfed in flames. The area was cordoned off and the LaGrange Fire department was immediately contacted. Firefighters arrived, extinguished the fire, and determined that the cause of the fire was due to a mechanical malfunction. No further police action was requested.

Ofc Nemecek responded to the 800 Block of Brighton Lane in reference to a Harassment Complaint. Upon arrival, a resident reported receiving disturbing text messages from an ex-employee who was accusing him preventing him from obtaining employment. Nemecek contacted the employee who admitted to sending the texts, was regretful, and agreed to stop all communications with the complainant.

#### ARRESTS:

Ofc Kaiser and FTO Irizarry arrested a 26-year old Burbank man on an outstanding La Grange warrant for Driving on a Suspended License. The man was taken into custody by Kaiser at the Hickory Hills police department, and processed on the original charge.

Ofc Comstock cited a 54-year old Cicero man for Leaving the Scene of an Accident and additional traffic violations when the man fled in his vehicle after being involved a collision near the intersection of La Grange Road and Brewster Avenue. A positive identification was made after Brookfield police curbed the vehicle a short distance away from the accident. The man was taken into custody charged.

Ofc Rogers arrested a 31-year old La Grange man on an outstanding CCSPD warrant for Violation of Parole. Cook County Adult Probation contacted the department advising of the order for the arrest of the man on the warrant. Rogers took the man into custody, without incident, at his residence in the 900 Block of west 41<sup>st</sup> Street.

Ofc Cassiberry and FTO Irizarry arrested a 25-year old homeless man for Retail Theft after officers responded to a retail store in the 00 Block of North La Grange Road. The man was reported to have stolen a bottle of alcoholic beverage from the business. After receiving a description of the suspect, he was located in Gordon Park where he was subsequently taken into custody. The stolen bottle was recovered by officers, and the man was brought to the station and charged.

### **OTHER POLICE ACTIVITY:**

The Afternoon shift completed 84 traffic contacts which included 7 Misdemeanor Traffic Arrests for Driving While License Suspended/Revoked. Officers completed 24 crash reports (2 Personal Injury) and issued 1 parking citation. Shift Officers conducted 77 Building/Business Checks and Foot Patrols.

### **TRAINING:**

The shift successfully completed the December 2016 Police Law Institute online training on: Arrest or Search (Probable Cause), Evaluation of Evidence, and the Legal Basis for Conviction (Beyond a Reasonable Doubt).

## **INVESTIGATIONS DIVISION ACTIVITIES**

### **INVESTIGATIONS:**

Investigative case reports taken/followed up on this month include: Financial Exploitation of the Elderly (1), Criminal Sexual Assault (1), Armed Robbery (2), Residential Burglary (2), Attempted Child Luring (1), Habitual Missing Juvenile (1), Disorderly Conduct (1), Theft (1) Commercial Burglary (1), and Unlawful Use of Credit Card (1).

Inv. Uher conducted follow-up investigation into a Forgery. Inv. Uher presented facts of the case to the court and was able to obtain an Arrest Warrant for an offender wanted in connection to the Forgery. Case pending arrest of offender.

Inv. Coleman conducted follow-up investigation into a Criminal Sexual Assault. Inv. Coleman collected additional evidence related to the incident. Inv. Coleman and Inv. Uher also interviewed several potential witnesses tied to the case. Case pending.

Inv. Uher conducted follow-up investigation into an Armed Robbery that occurred at Radio Shack in October 2016. Inv. Uher learned evidence submitted to the Illinois State Police Crime Laboratory was being analyzed for the presence of DNA.

Inv. Coleman assisted the Day Shift with investigating a Disorderly Conduct. Inv. Coleman is in the process of identifying a suspect and whether or not they may be associated with the victim. Case pending.

Inv. Uher conducted follow-up investigation into an Armed Robbery that occurred at Verizon Wireless in August 2015. Inv. Uher learned evidence submitted to the Illinois State Police Crime Laboratory was analyzed for the presence of DNA and was found to be insufficient samples or not suitable for comparison. Case Closed.

Inv. Coleman conducted follow-up investigation into a Habitual Missing Juvenile. Inv. Coleman provided information to the National Center Missing and Exploited Children in order to help locate the juvenile. Inv. Coleman also obtained dental records as required by Illinois Statue. Case pending.

Inv. Uher conducted follow-up investigation into a Theft. Inv. Uher was able to obtain and review surveillance video from a local church of the incident and get a partial description of the offending vehicle. A Critical Reach Flier was distributed to local agencies in an attempt to identify the vehicle and offender(s). Case closed.

Inv. Coleman conducted follow-up investigation into an Attempted Child Luring incident. Inv. Coleman arranged a Forensic Interview of the child/victim through All Our Children's Advocacy Center (AOCAC). Prior to the interview Coleman and Inv. Uher checked the area of occurrence and located a subject matching the same description as the suspect. After speaking to the subject, investigators did not attend the Forensic Interview. It was determined no criminal intent was committed by the subject and the incident was a misunderstanding. Case closed.

Inv. Uher assisted the Midnight Shift with processing a Commercial Burglary scene at the Sprint Store. Inv. Uher was able to recover and review surveillance video of the incident. A Critical Reach Flier was distributed to local agencies in an attempt to identify the offender. Case closed.

Inv. Coleman assisted the Day and Afternoon Shift with a Death Investigation. Inv. Coleman processed the scene for evidence and documented the scene. Inv. Coleman also coordinated with the Cook County Medical Examiner's Office during the investigation. Case closed.

Inv. Uher and Coleman conducted follow-up investigation into a Residential Burglary incident. Investigators processed evidence collected from the scene for latent prints. A check of Leads Online was conducted for items taken during the burglary with negative results. Case closed.

Inv. Coleman conducted follow-up investigation into an ongoing Financial Exploitation of Elderly case. Inv. Coleman is in the process of obtaining banking information as well as video surveillance. Case pending.

Inv. Uher conducted follow-up investigation into an Unlawful Use of Credit Card incident. Inv. Uher was able to obtain and review surveillance video of the offender(s). A Critical Reach Flier was distributed to local agencies in an attempt to identify offender(s) and the vehicle they used. Case closed.

Inv. Coleman assisted the Day Shift with a Residential Burglary incident. Inv. Coleman processed the scene for evidence and documented the scene. Inv. Coleman also collected surveillance video from the area and developed two suspect vehicles. A Critical Reach Flier was later created and distributed to local agencies. Inv. Coleman obtained a detailed list of items taken during the burglary.

**AUXILIARY AND PART-TIME POLICE UNITS**

The Auxiliary Unit volunteered 108 hours during the month of December. As always, the unit had a significant impact on the safety and security of attendees at the Annual Home Town Holiday Event. Other time was spent conducting house checks, street lights out lists and various patrol duties. They also serve as a partner to patrol officers out on the beat.

The Part-time Officers made 18 traffic contacts, which included 8 citations and 1 misdemeanor Driving While Suspended/Revoked. They were also active during the month conducting directed traffic patrols and assisting the full-time officers where necessary.

The parking division registered \$9,275 in parking fines through conventional payments, on-line payments, or collection efforts.
