Re: Monthly Report for March 2018

Attached for your review are the general statistics for the shift activities for the month of March 2018. March was a rather busy month for the police department, with several noteworthy events.



On Wednesday, March 14, police department staff assisted the administration of LT North to ensure the "National School Walkout" event occurred safely. In coordination with school staff, two police officers blocked Cossitt Avenue from Park Road to Brainard Avenue at 10 a.m. so that students participating in the event could safely exit the north side of the school and cross Cossitt Avenue. The school administration had worked with student leaders in the days leading up to the event and were informed that students would be congregating in front of the Vaughan Building. The event went extremely well, and officers kept Cossitt closed off until all students re-entered the school. Total time of the event was about 25 minutes.

In the early morning hours of Friday, March 16, 2018, Officer Comstock observed a subject riding a suspected stolen bicycle in the 400 block of East Avenue. Officer Comstock recalled the description of the stolen bicycle from a photo he had seen at roll call prior to the start of his shift. Officer Comstock, while being assisted by Officer Kang, subsequently obtained a confession from the subject riding the bicycle that he did, indeed, steal the bicycle two days earlier from a residence in the 300 block of E. Franklin. The victim chose not to sign complaints but was extremely grateful that the La Grange Police Department recovered his bicycle. The offender, a Brookfield resident, was cited for possession of cannabis but was released without further charges.

On Tuesday, March 20, 2018, Deputy Chief Peters and Chief Bluder attended the annual Northeast Multi-Regional Training (NEMRT) meeting. NEMRT is one of fourteen mobile law enforcement training teams throughout Illinois and is partially funded by the state. As part of NEMRT's annual meeting, Attorney Charles Hervas provided training on Managing Law Enforcement Today: Police Discipline and Civil Rights Liability



On Thursday evening, March 22, 2018, Chief Bluder, Deputy Chief Peters, Officer McDermott, Officer Andries and Officer Kaiser participated in the Cops N Kids Charity Basketball Game held at Gurrie Middle School. This is an annual event that involves the La Grange, Countryside and Hodgkins Police Departments. The law enforcement team plays the Gurrie Middle School Team. It was a close game, but the law enforcement team lost by two points at the buzzer. All proceeds raised from this event benefit the Special Olympics.



On Tuesday, March 27th and Wednesday, March 28th, several members of the police department attended Active Threat/Rapid Deployment training at the Lyons Township South Campus. The training was coordinated and funded by the Cook County Department of Homeland Security and Emergency Management. Numerous agencies from throughout Cook County participated in this excellent training. This training provides an opportunity for officers from area agencies to work together and to better understand the capabilities of the Cook County Department of Homeland Security.



DAY SHIFT ACTIVITIES

AFTERNOON SHIFT ACTIVITIES

INVESTIGATIONS:

Ofc. McDermott responded to the 200 block of N. Kensington in reference to a Criminal Damage to Property report. A resident advised that wires to his video surveillance system were cut by an unknown offender.

Ofc. Niewold responded to the 300 block of E. Plainfield in reference to a Neighbor Dispute. A resident reported she believed that a downstairs neighbor placed an unknown substance (possibly glue) on her doorknob to her apartment. No permanent damage was reported.

Ofc Niewold responded to the 800 block of South LaGrange in reference to a Child Custody Dispute. A resident reported a disagreement took place that involved the child's father, who was present at the scene. The man agreed to leave, and peace was restored.

P/O Piraino and FTO Irizarry responded to the 800 block of Hillberry Court in reference to a Burglary report. A resident reported that a mountain bike was stolen from a shed located on the property. No suspects were reported.

Officers Niewold and Wessendorf responded to the 300 block of Bluff in reference to a Neighbor Dispute. Upon arrival, officers learned that the argument was verbal only and both parties were separated and warned to stay away from each other.

Ofc. McDermott responded to the 00 block of S. LaGrange in reference to a Theft. A man reported that while at an area business he misplaced his wallet. Upon finding the wallet, he noticed approximately \$300 dollars missing. The case was closed.

Sgt. Wardlaw responded to the police department lobby in reference to a Harassment report. A resident in the 800 block of S. LaGrange Rd. reported that an ex-boyfriend has been sending her messages/images over a variety of social media sites. The incident was reported as a matter of record.

Ofc. Burrell responded to the 900 block of S. Catherine in reference to a Violation of an Order of Protection. The offender in this case was eventually arrested by detectives and officers from the day shift.

Ofc. Irizarry responded to the PD lobby to speak with a resident reporting Harassment via email. The man stated he received several emails and communication that he perceived to be threatening in nature, from a previous business contact.

Ofc. Irizarry responded to the PD lobby for a Juvenile Mischief complaint. A male juvenile and his father reported that older juveniles got into a shoving match with his son (and friends) after a sporting event in the 00 block of N. Catherine. No injuries were reported, and no criminal complaints were signed.

Ofc. Niewold, along with additional LaGrange patrol units, responded to the 1100 block of S. Waiola in reference to a Domestic Battery complaint. It was reported that a woman was pushed from a vehicle onto the street. Upon interviewing the involved parties, each advised there was no physical contact whatsoever and declined further police action.

Ofc. Burrell and other LaGrange patrol units responded to the vicinity of LaGrange and Hillgrove in reference to a Hit and Run Accident. The driver of the at-fault vehicle fled the scene after striking 3 vehicles in the roadway. No injuries were reported, and the violator's vehicle was towed from the scene.

Ofc Irizarry and other LaGrange patrol units responded to the 700 block of S. 6th for a report of a possible Burglary. Upon entering the residence, the homeowner advised she knew the man who

entered her home and he was presently inside. Officers checked the remainder of the home, and perimeter and determined there to be no foul play.

Ofc. McDermott responded to the 500 block of S. Park in reference to a Violation of an Order of protection complaint. Upon arrival, a Suspect was identified, but a review of the O.O.P. determined that the woman did not violate any of the terms of the court order.

Ofc. Irizarry responded to the 00 block of S. Ashland in reference to a Well-Being Check. The man was located without any issues. No further police action was requested.

ARRESTS:

The Afternoon shift completed 104 traffic contacts, which included 2 Misdemeanor Traffic Arrests for Driving While License Suspended/Revoked, and 2 DUIs. Officers completed 30 crash reports (1 Personal Injury) and issued 7 parking citations. Shift Officers conducted 40 Building/Business Checks and Foot Patrols.

The Afternoon Shift hosted a 22-ya Brookfield PD police intern for a one-day Patrol ride-along. The student, from Western Illinois University, rode with Ofc. McDermott and Squad Leader Wessendorf.

Ofc. McDermott participated in the Cops vs. Kids (DARE) annual basketball game played at Gurrie Junior High.

TRAINING:

The shift successfully completed the March 2018 Police Law Institute online training on the following: Probable Cause for Arrest/Search, Evaluation of Evidence (Police and Prosecutor), and Legal Basis for Conviction.

Several Afternoon Shift officers participated in Rapid Deployment Training conducted at Lyons Township High School (South Campus).

Sgt. Wardlaw completed the National Incident Management System's ICS Level 300 and Level 400 Courses, conducted in Glenview (NIPSTA).

Sgt. Wardlaw completed the De-Escalation and Smarter Policing Course conducted at the Mundelein PD.

Ofc. Niewold completed training with the Northern Illinois Police Alarm System Field Force.

MIDNIGHT SHIFT ACTIVITIES

INVESTIGATIONS:

Ofc. Nemecek and Ofc. Andries responded to the area of LaGrange/Elm Ave. for a rolling domestic disturbance involving a father and his teenage son who were traveling in the father's vehicle. The two had become involved in a verbal argument. The parents are divorced, and the son was visiting his father. Peace was restored, parties were separated, and the mother arrived and took her son back to her residence.

Ofc. Kang, Ofc. Nemecek, Ofc. Comstock, Sgt. Rohlicek and Sgt. Ljubenko responded to the 0-100 block of S. Spring Ave. for a domestic disturbance between a male subject and his girlfriend. The two became involved in a verbal argument which led to them pushing/shoving each other. Both subjects suffered minor scratches on their arms and neck area. Both declined medical attention. Peace was restored, no complaints signed, mutual combatants. The male subject agreed to leave the residence for the night and stay with a relative. Domestic violence/information forms provided to subjects.

Ofc. Kang, Ofc. Nemecek, Ofc. Andries and Sgt. Ljubenko responded to the 700 block of S. LaGrange Rd. for a single vehicle accident in which the vehicle hit a tree in the parkway and then rolled onto its side. The male juvenile driver was transported by LaGrange F.D. Ambulance to Loyola Medical Center for medical treatment. The driver was cited for several traffic violations to include driving on a Graduated Driver's License (GDL) outside of permitted time.

Ofc. Andries, Ofc. Nemecek and Sgt. Ljubenko responded to the 900 block of S. Catherine Ave. for a reported Violation of an Order of Protection (V.O.O.P.). The female complainant's husband had come to the residence and attempted to gain entry in violation of an active order of protection. The husband then fled the scene prior to the officers' arrival. Officers searched the area with negative results. The complainant advised she wanted the husband arrested and she subsequently signed the required criminal complaints. Later in the morning, the husband returned to the residence and was arrested by Day Shift officers. He was subsequently charged with (4) counts of V.O.O.P.

Ofc. Comstock observed a male subject on a bike in the 400 block of East Ave. The subject and bike matched the description of an offender and bike that was reported stolen a few days earlier. Ofc. Kang arrived to assist in the investigation. The victim positively identified the bike as

belonging to him. The male subject subsequently admitted to stealing the bike, though the victim declined to pursue criminal charges against the subject. The bike was returned to the victim/owner.

S/L Herrera, Ofc. Comstock, Ofc. Andries and Sgt. Rohlicek responded to the 1300 block of W. Maple Ave. for a suspicious incident. The complainant advised that after pulling her vehicle into the driveway of a residence, she observed a vehicle drive up and park on the street behind her. A male subject exited the vehicle, walked up to the complainant's vehicle and pulled on her locked door handle. The complainant immediately backed out of the driveway, drove from the area and contacted this P.D. The complainant believed the subject was wearing some type of mask. Officers searched the area with negative results, the incident is under investigation.

Ofc. Nemecek, Ofc. Comstock and Sgt. Wardlaw responded to the 0-100 block of N. Peck Ave. for a domestic disturbance between a male subject and his girlfriend. The two became involved in a verbal altercation. No injuries were sustained, no complaints signed. Peace was restored, and the subjects were separated for the night.

Ofc. Comstock, Ofc. Nemecek and Sgt. Rohlicek responded to the 0-100 block of N. Spring Ave. for a domestic disturbance between a female subject and her boyfriend. The two became involved in a verbal argument. No injuries were sustained, no complaints signed. Peace was restored, and the female subject left the residence for the evening.

Sgt. Rohlicek responded to and investigated a burglary to motor vehicle in the area of Harris/Madison Ave. The vehicle's rear passenger side window was broken, and the vehicle was entered, though nothing was reported missing. Evidence was collected, and the incident is under investigation.

Ofc. Nemecek and Sgt. Ljubenko responded to and investigated the burglary to motor vehicle in the 100 block of W. Cossitt Ave. The vehicle's (SUV) rear window was broken and various snowboarding equipment and jumper cables were taken out of the rear cargo/storage area. Nothing else was disturbed or missing from the vehicle. The incident is under investigation.

Ofc. Nemecek took a theft of lost/mislaid property report at LaGrange Memorial Hospital (LMH). A female subject/patient left her cellphone in a lobby restroom, when she returned she could not find the phone. Phone was later found in bed linens and returned to subject.

Ofc. Comstock, Ofc. Nemecek, and Sgt. Ljubenko responded to the domestic disturbance in the 700 block of Brighton Lane. Two brothers became involved in a verbal altercation. No injuries sustained, no complaints signed. Subjects were separated for the night.

ARRESTS:

Ofc. Comstock arrested a 30-year-old female subject from LaGrange for Driving under the Influence (D.U.I.). Subject was processed and released on bond with a return court date.

OTHER POLICE ACTIVITY:

The Midnight shift completed 126 traffic contacts, which included 4 misdemeanor Traffic Arrests for Driving while License Suspended/Revoked/No Valid D/L and investigated 1 personal injury

traffic accident and 4 property damage traffic accidents, two of which were hit & run accidents. Shift Officers issued 186 parking citations for overnight parking and other violations. Shift Officers conducted 78 Building/Business Premise Checks and Foot Patrols. In addition, Ofc. Andries continued teaching the spring semester DARE curriculum to the 5th grade classes at St. John's and St. Cletus schools. He also began teaching the 5th grade classes at Spring Ave. School.

TRAINING:

The shift successfully completed the March 2018 Police Law Institute online training along with the Lexipol Daily Training Bulletins. In addition, Sgt. Rohlicek and Sgt. Ljubenko attended the ILEAS Training Conference in Springfield. Ofc. Kang completed the De-Escalation & Smarter Policing training course, Ofc. Nemecek completed Active Shooter/Rapid Deployment training conducted at LTHS-South Campus, Sgt. Ljubenko attended the quarterly Terrorism Liaison Officer Committee (TLOC) training seminar with the FBI and Sgt. Rohlicek completed the International Association for Property & Evidence (IAPE) training course in Kenosha, WI.

INVESTIGATIONS DIVISION ACTIVITIES

INVESTIGATIONS:

Investigative case reports taken/followed up on this month include: (2) Theft, (1) Deceptive Practice, (1) Criminal Damage to Property, (1) Identity Theft, (1) Theft by Deception, (1) Harassment through Electronic Communication, (2) Suspicious Activity, (1) Hit and Run crash, (1) Disorderly Conduct, (1) Criminal Damage to Vehicle, (1) Aggravated Assault, (1) Residential Burglary, (1) Violation of Order of Protection, and (1) Violation of Bail Bond.

Inv. Coleman conducted follow-up into a Theft incident occurring in the 00 block of N. LaGrange Rd. Inv. Coleman learned the victim's wallet was taken and their credit card was later unlawfully used to make purchases in Hodgkins and Willowbrook, Illinois. Inv. Coleman is in the process of identifying suspects and obtaining surveillance footage. Case pending.

Inv. Fulla conducted follow-up in regards to a Deceptive Practice incident occurring in the 00 block of S. LaGrange Rd. where a suspect sold fraudulent tickets to the victim. Inv. Fulla is in the process of obtaining surveillance video footage of the transaction(s). Case pending.

Inv. Coleman and Inv. Fulla conducted follow-up investigation into a Criminal Damage to Property incident occurring at the Village Parking Garage. The Investigators reviewed video surveillance footage and were unable to identify suspect(s) or suspect vehicle(s). Case closed.

Inv. Fulla conducted follow-up into an Identity Theft and Theft by Deception incident. Inv. Fulla learned the fraudulent transactions occurred in Madison, Wisconsin by an unknown person. The case is closed due to a lack of a suspect.

Inv. Coleman conducted follow-up investigation into an incident of Harassment through Electronic Communication occurring in the 800 block of S. LaGrange Rd. Due to the victim wishing not to pursue the matter, the case was closed.

Inv. Fulla and Inv. Coleman conducted a follow-up investigation into a Suspicious Activity incident that occurred in the 00 block of LaGrange Rd. An unknown subject presented a \$100.00 USC note to an employee to purchase food, which the employee believed to be counterfeit. The suspect left with the note and the business sustained no loss. Inv. Fulla is in the process of obtaining surveillance video footage in order to identify the suspect. Case pending.

Inv. Coleman conducted follow-up investigation into a Theft of a Credit Card incident that led to the stolen credit card being unlawfully used by unknown subject(s). Inv. Coleman is attempting to obtain surveillance video footage of the unknown subject(s) using the stolen credit card at area Target Store locations. Case pending.

Inv. Fulla conducted a follow-up investigation into a Hit and Run Crash that occurred at Hillgrove Ave. and LaGrange Rd. Inv. Fulla and Ofc. Burrell identified a suspect in the crash. Inv. Fulla and Inv. Coleman are in the process of locating the suspect for an interview. Case pending.

Inv. Fulla investigated a Disorderly Conduct incident occurring in the 00 block of S. LaGrange Rd. where a subject asked peculiar questions related to the security of an author. The suspect was later located and questioned about the incident. No direct threat was identified towards the business or author. The suspect was later issued a No Trespass notice and prohibited from entering the property. Case closed.

Inv. Coleman conducted follow-up investigation into Criminal Damage to Vehicle and Aggravated Assault incident occurring at LaGrange Rd. and Burlington Ave. Inv. Coleman and Inv. Fulla attempted to locate the suspect with negative results. Inv. Coleman is in the process of obtaining an arrest warrant for the suspect. Case pending.

Inv. Fulla assisted the Midnight Shift with investigating a Suspicious Person/Incident occurring in the 1300 block of W. Maple Ave. In summary, an unknown person approached the victim and attempted to enter their vehicle without consent while the victim occupied the vehicle. Inv. Fulla retrieved surveillance video footage of the area and is in the process of identifying a suspect and suspect vehicle. Case pending.

Inv. Coleman and Inv. Fulla assisted the Day Shift with investigating a Residential Burglary and Stolen Motor Vehicle incident occurring in the 800 block of S. Waiola Ave. Investigators processed the scene for evidence and recovered the victim's vehicle in unincorporated Westmont, Illinois. Investigators obtained surveillance video of a suspect and vehicle. Case pending.

ARRESTS:

Inv. Coleman assisted the Afternoon Shift with locating a subject wanted for violating an Order of Protection in the 900 block of S. Catherine Ave. Inv. Coleman, with assistance from the Major Case Assistance Team and the Downers Grove PD, located suspect Edward Duer, 43 years of age, in Downers Grove, IL. Duer was subsequently charged with Violation of Order of Protection and Violation of Bail Bond.

Inv. Coleman and Inv. Fulla conducted Tobacco Enforcement Compliance checks of local businesses. A total of eight licensed businesses were checked and seven were found to be in

compliance. One business was found to be out of compliance due to the sale of tobacco products to a minor. The clerk and license holder were issued a Local Ordinance compliance citation for the violation.

OTHER POLICE ACTIVITY:

Inv. Coleman and Inv. Uher attended the Major Case Assistance Team (M.C.A.T.) meeting hosted by Brookfield PD.

Inv. Fulla attended the West Suburban Juvenile Officers Association (W.S.J.O.A.) monthly meeting hosted by Hodgkins PD.

Inv. Coleman and Inv. Fulla conducted School Resource duties at LTHS. Investigators attended Brownstock Day (a musical festival) at LTHS. Inv. Coleman also issued a Civil Citation to a juvenile found in possession of cannabis.

Inv. Fulla assisted Sgt. Wardlaw and Sgt. Cimbalista with Active Threat training for St. Francis School staff.

Inv. Coleman attended a two-day Sexual Assault Investigation training.

Inv. Coleman, as the department's Elderly Services Officer, provided assistance to a resident.

AUXILIARY AND PART-TIME POLICE UNITS

The Auxiliary Unit volunteered 75 hours during the month of March. Time was spent conducting house checks, street lights out list, assisting at the La Grange Park District's Easter Egg Hunt, two St Patrick's Day Parades and assisting with election details.

The part-time officers completed 29 traffic contacts, which included 16 citations. They were also active during the month responding to 93 calls for service in the community.

PARKING DIVISION

The parking division registered \$17,325 in parking fines through conventional payments, online payments or collection efforts.
