# LA GRANGE FIRE DEPARTMENT MAY 2016



### A MESSAGE FROM THE FIRE CHIEF

There has been a lot of information on the Zika virus in the news lately. The La Grange Fire Department is working closely with the Cook County Department of Public Health who is closely monitoring the Zika virus and will provide updates as new information becomes available.

At this time, there is little risk of acquiring the Zika virus as a resident of La Grange unless you have had relations with someone who has traveled to a country where Zika is already present which could lead to the infection. Cook County is closely monitoring the situation for the spread of infected mosquitoes.

There are several other diseases spread by mosquitoes and you should take precautions to limit the spread regarding all of them. The Village of La Grange is included in the Des Plaines Valley Mosquito Abatement District, which does regular monitoring and spraying during mosquito season.

### **CALLS OF NOTE**

On May 5, 2016, at 1344 hours, La Grange Co. 1111 responded auto-aid to the 4200 block of Forest Avenue in Brookfield for the report of a house fire. Upon arrival, La Grange crews assisted with interior ventilation and overhaul operations.

On May 6, 2016, at 0901 hours, La Grange companies responded to the 00 block of S. Stone Avenue for the smell of gas inside the residence. Upon arrival, crews did not detect the odor of gas nor were they able to find a source. The resident was advised to re-contact the fire department if the odor came back.

On May 6, 2016, at 1951 hours, La Grange and auto-aid companies responded to the 00 block of S. 6<sup>th</sup> Avenue for the automatic fire alarm. Upon arrival, crews found the activation on the third floor was due to cooking in unit 301. Unit was ventilated, alarm reset and all companies released.

On May 8, 2016, at 1545 hours, La Grange companies responded to the 1200 block of S. Brainard for the smell of natural gas in the basement. Upon arrival, crews found a pinhole leak in the flexible gas line to the dryer. The gas to the dryer was isolated, the basement was ventilated and the homeowner was advised to have the gas line replaced.

On May 12, 2016 at 0317 hours, La Grange Co. 1112 responded auto-aid to 4400 block of Blanchan in Brookfield for the reported structure fire. Upon arrival, the crew was assigned to ventilation and conducted a primary search. The crew also assisted Brookfield with re-bedding hose before being released by Brookfield command.

On May 15, 2016 at 2237 hours, La Grange and auto-aid companies responded to the 700 block of W. Hillgrove for the reported structure fire. Upon arrival, crews found a fire on the second floor rear porch. The fire was contained to the wicker furniture with no extension to the building. The cause of the fire was discarded smoking materials.

On May 22, 2016 at 1904 hours, La Grange Co. 1111 responded to La Grange Towers at 141 N. La Grange Road for the couple who could not exit their condominium. Upon arrival, crews found the entry doorknob to the unit was loose and difficult to operate. After gaining entry, the crew tightened the hardware and exercised the knob so that it would move easier.

On May 25, 2016 at 1815 hours, La Grange Co. 1111 responded to the 100 block of North La Grange Road for people stuck in the elevator. Upon arrival, crews located the elevator car and made contact with the residents. Power was shut down to the elevator and the elevator was recalled to the first floor were the residents were released.

On May 27, 2016 at 1039 hours, La Grange Co. 1112 responded as a change of quarter's company for the structure fire in the 4000 block of Leland in Lyons. The crews remained on scene until released by Lyons command.

On May 29, 2016 at 1904 hours, La Grange and auto-aid companies responded to the parking garage for the AFA. Upon arrival, crews found a small intentionally set fire on the 3<sup>rd</sup> floor landing of the north stairwell. The fire was extinguished and the alarm was reset. La Grange Police were going to review surveillance camera footage.

On May 30, 2016 at 1012 hours, La Grange and auto-aid companies responded to the 00 block of S. La Grange Road for the AFA. Upon arrival, crews found the hood and duct system had activated and extinguished a stovetop fire. The business was shut down until the hood and duct system could be repaired, and the village's health department could verify proper cleanup had taken place. The business completed all the required work and was allowed to re-open later that evening.


#### La Grange Firefighters Annual Golf Outing






### **INCIDENT CALL COMPARISONS YTD FOR 2014-2016**
